
CPS Sexual Health Education

The Chicago Public Schools (CPS) sexual health education curriculum builds a foundation of knowledge and skills for students in kindergarten through 12th grade. To help students make informed decisions and safe choices, the CPS curriculum covers topics such as human development, healthy relationships, decision making, abstinence, contraception and disease prevention. Trained Instructors

Every school has two trained instructors who have completed the CPS Sexual Health Education Instructor training.

SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR

Taught Every Year

Sexual health education is taught to all students. From $K-4^{\text{\tiny TH}}$ grade there are 300 minutes per year of instruction, and from 5[™]–12[™] grade there are 675 minutes.

CPS sexual health education is medically accurate, age appropriate, and comprehensive.

Abstinence


Abstinence is taught as the only 100% effective way to prevent pregnancy, STIs, and HIV, and students learn skills to help them stay abstinent.

Opt Out


Parents/guardians will receive at least one written notification that sexual health will be taught. Parents/guardians can opt out their child(ren) of one or all lessons.*
